Training a new vine trunk & removing remaining water shoots in Blocks B, C & E
Drip tube installation Blocks A, B, C, D, E, F, G & H
Irrigation installation in Blocks H, I & J.
Irrigation installation- Mainline/submain.
Strainer post installation.
Cordon & drip wire installation.
Planting vines.
Install vine guards.

VITICULTURAL COMMENTS

The wet conditions continue through November with 13 wet days and over 140mm falling to 21st November, surpassing the wettest November on record.

The vineyards are very wet and vineyard traffic to manage disease pressure is causing ruts throughout the vineyards. Once the vineyards dry out we will assess and record the damaged areas via GPS marking and use this information to cost the works required to repair affected rows and headlands. a late season fungicide to help prevent Botrytis.
